NEW CATHOLIC PRIMARY SCHOOLS: the Diocese is applying to build 3 new Catholic primary schools, two in Peterborough and one in our area, at Northstowe. We have to put in a submission by 1st **February** and show that there is support among the Catholic community for such schools; any new school would open in September 2022 or 2023. By then the A14 will be open and it would be a short journey to a school in Northstowe. There are details at both doors and also a form to send in your support for these schools. To support them you do not have to be a parent, but simply be part of our community. CHURCH FLOWERS: we all like to see the Church decorated with flowers on Sundays, but they do not just arrive there. We are very grateful to a small group of ladies who arrange the flowers for us to make the Church look loved and cared for. We need some new helpers to go on a rota to do the flowers, it is not a big deal, just a couple of vases near the tabernacle and the statues. If you could help it comes round about every five or six weeks, please let Fr Philip know: it would be wonderful to have Polish, Indian and Filipino style flowers for our Church, as well as English ones.

VOTICE CANDLE STAND in the Lady Chapel is now in use with candles provided. **PLEASE USE YOUR COMMON SENSE & BE CAREFUL.** We don't want another fire! Only use the votive lights provided, do not bring others; only place them in the cups on the stand; **DO NOT** put them on the wooden shelf, next to the wooden statue, wood burns; don't put lit candles on the lower tray, it is a fire hazard. If the cups are full, light your candle and then blow it out and leave it on the lower tray, it will be lit later. Sorry for all the rules, but we need to use our common sense and lots of care not to risk a fire.

GIFT AID ENVELOPES are available, please remember to collect your set. I encourage you to sign a Gift Aid form if you pay tax and give money to the Church and have not yet signed a form. Gift Aid is a very valuable source of income to our parish and does not cost you anything.
