ROSARY RALLY In his letter on the month of May, Pope Francis writes: It is traditional in this month to pray the Rosary at home within the family. The restrictions of the pandemic have made us come to appreciate all the more this "family" aspect, also from a spiritual point of view. For this reason, I want you to encourage everyone to rediscover the beauty OF PRAYING THE ROSARY AT HOME IN THIS MONTH OF May. This can be done as a group or individually; you can decide according to your own situations, making the most of both opportunities. The key to doing this is always simplicity and it is easy also on the internet to find good models of prayer to follow.

In response to Pope Francis' request there has been a Rosary Mission co-hosted by the London Rosary Shrine, Walsingham Basilica, Carfin Grotto and Rosary on the Coast.

Bishop Alan asks us all to take part in the culmination of this initiative – a Rosary Relay - on **Sunday May 31**st. Each Diocese has been asked to encourage everyone to pray the Rosary at a designated hour. The Diocese of East Anglia has been asked to pray the Rosary between 14.00 and 15.00 on **Sunday May 31**st, Pentecost Sunday. Bishop Alan will lead the Rosary at 14.00 which will be live streamed from St John the Baptist's cathedral.

The focus for our prayer intentions is:

For faith, the sanctity of life and peace in the world:

For an end to the Covid 19 virus, for the sick and dying, for the dead and the grieving, for all health workers and carers, for those researching for an anti-virus;

For the protection of the common good & people's economic livelihoods;

For the poor, homeless and destitute;

That the Holy Spirit will preserve us from disaster and war.

I will lead the Rosary here at 14.30 on Sunday afternoon, giving you chance to join the Bishop if you wish and also to join me for this prayer.

<u>FIRST HOLY COMMUNION</u> all classes are cancelled for the time being. Please revise the book & keep this topic alive for the children, you could also use a video of one of our Masses to help the children to understand the Mass better.

<u>DIOCESAN NEWS:</u> the news from around the Diocese, is available on the Diocesan website, www.rcdea.org.uk it helps to keep you in touch with the Church. There is also a list of Churches in our Diocese who are live streaming Mass regularly.

<u>PLANNING PERMISSION</u> the Diocesan Office has given us permission to go ahead now and make a formal planning application for our plans to develop the Church and to build a new presbytery. We shall begin this process as soon as possible.

The parish Finance Committee are very aware that the future is uncertain, however we feel that we can use this time to get necessary permissions and costings to be able to put the full picture to you in the next few months when hopefully we will be able to meet again for Mass.
