DAY OFF: my day off has always been Tuesday and now that lockdown is being lifted, I am going to re-instate it, so there will be no Mass on Tuesdays and the meditations will move to Wednesday and Friday.

OPENING FOR PRIVATE PRAYER: it was lovely to see about a dozen people coming to the Church for private prayer on Wednesday, clearly answering a need. We will continue to open each week on Wednesdays from 11.00 – 13.00 and on Sundays from 13.00 – 16.00. If there is a greater demand on Sunday, we will extend the opening hours, I will review after today. At this stage, the toilets will not be available. We need a few volunteers to join me in being stewards, 2 for Wednesday and 3 for Sunday, to stay for one hour each. Please volunteer via email with a set day and time, I will talk through the role with you when you volunteer.

Entrance to the Church will via the GS Room from the back door in the garden, all doors will be open, so there should be very little you need to touch, sanitiser will be available. You are welcome to wear your own mask in the church.

This will be a small beginning, if there is greater demand, we will open the church for longer times, but more stewards will be needed.

MIDWEEK MEDITATION: twice a week there is a live streamed midweek meditation available for you all on YouTube/Facebook. The meditation is a short talk based on the readings of the following Sunday, to give you a thought for the day and to help you prepare for Mass on Sunday. I will now record them on Wednesday and Friday at 10.30, you are welcome to join me live or view later.

FIRST HOLY COMMUNION all classes are cancelled for the time being. Please revise the book & keep this topic alive for the children, you could also use a video of one of our Masses to help the children to understand the Mass better.

CELEBRATE 7 YEARS OF POPE FRANCIS:

Margaret Beaufort Institute of Theology Zoom Seminar Series led by Dr Peter Coughlan. Pope Francis completed his seventh year as Bishop of Rome in March this year. This seminar – with three sessions in July and three in October - will reflect on some of the significant features of his pontificate to date.

There will be three sessions in July:

- (1) will search for the heart of Francis' pontificate. What are his hopes for the Church & its mission? (2) will look at *Evangelli gaudium The Joy of the Gospel*.
- (3) will focus on 'the name of God is mercy'. Francis constantly returns to the absolute centrality of mercy.

In October there will be three sessions:

- (1) will consider ways in which Pope Francis is seeking renewal in the Church, especially through 'synodality'.
- (2) will present questions of the relationship between 'care for humanity's common home'.
- (3) the inequalities & injustice present in our world.
