



Lent Course: Let us Dream




Our Lent course this year will have three sessions based on a new book by Pope Francis entitled "Let us Dream"; it is the Pope's reflections on the pandemic and the dream that we can come out this crisis a better world. Three sessions on the Pope's book will be bracketed with a talk on Lent

in general, looking at the Sunday gospel readings as a whole; we will finish with a closer look at Holy Week.

These sessions will be on Mondays at 14.30, they will be live streamed on YouTube, they will be available for you to view when convenient for you in the usual place.

Stations of the Cross

There will be Stations of the Cross every Sunday at 18.00 to follow Jesus on the way of the Cross and meditate on his journey of suffering to the cross. It is not possible to do the Stations in the usual live stream because of moving the camera.



Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament

There will be Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament every Thursday morning after Mass from 10.00 - 10.45. this will simply be a time of silent prayer which you are invited to attend to listen to and wait on God. The midweek meditation will bring this time of prayer to a close each week.

Fasting is very much part of our faith and is found many times in the Bible, people fasting for a particular intention before God and using their fasting as an intense form of prayer.
