MASS COUNT has now finished for this year, it shows interesting figures: our average attendance over the 4 weeks was 229 including Papworth, plus 98 for the Polish community. Last year we were 103 with 61 for the Polish community: before the pandemic we were 287 plus 160 in the Polish community. Our highest attendance was 96 at one Mass, for the Polish community over 100 twice.
