VIGIL MASS AT ST MICHAEL'S: this Mass on Saturday evening was added as we started to come out of lockdown to give a little more space in the church on Sunday mornings. It has grown slowly but now does help reduce the crush on Sundays, but it is rather late in the evening.

After consulting those who usually attend this Mass, I have decided to change the time to make it an hour earlier. From Saturday 2^{nd} July the vigil Mass will be at 18.00.

MASS AT PAPWORTH: after consultation with the people at Papworth I have decided to close the Saturday evening Mass there with effect from **Saturday 18th June**. Four Masses every weekend for the last 40 years has finally caught up with me and it is now too much on a regular basis. The Bishop has agreed this closure. I am grateful to the community at Papworth for their support and understanding in this matter.

FIRST HOLY COMMUNIONS: the children are making their First Communions on the Sundays during June. The church could be busier than usual but there is plenty of room at Saturday evening Mass at 19.00.
